What They Do:

United Methodist Family Services (UMFS) began as an orphanage in 1899, and today they provide a comprehensive network of services to children and families across Virginia by specializing in treatment foster care and adoption, intensive residential treatment and crisis intervention services for adolescents, FamilyCARE services (collaboration, advocacy, resources, empowerment), and specialized education services for adolescents including students with Autism.

How To Get Involved:

- Subject Tutors, Life Skills Tutors, Mentors, Open Table Participant.
- Our Family Champions are a group of volunteers in our local community who support UMFS in a number of ways including providing meals and treats, collecting critical items, and celebrating birthdays and special moments for the kids and families we serve.



Generosity Feeds

What They Do:

Generosity Feeds works hard to build relationships and inspire Generosity in order to feed hungry children in every county across America so all children have the opportunity to thrive. They do this through meaning packing events that are fun and easy enough for the whole family to get involved in.

How To Get Involved:

Hands On Greater Richmond

What They Do:

HandsOn Greater Richmond provides a link for individuals, families, teams, and corporate groups to join together and engage in meaningful volunteer opportunities within the Greater Richmond region. We offer unique, fun, and flexible ways to get connected and involved and provide volunteer management resources to the nonprofit sector.

How To Get Involved:

Habitat For Humanity (Richmond Metropolitan)

What They Do:

Richmond Habitat for Humanity is committed to making affordable and safe housing a reality for low-income families. And with the help of donations, volunteers, proceeds from our *ReStore*, and hard work from our home buyers, we're making that dream possible for hundreds of residents in the Richmond Metropolitan area.

Their vision is a world where everyone has a decent place to live. Seeking to put God's love into action, Richmond Metropolitan Habitat for Humanity brings people together to build homes, communities and hope.

How To Get Involved:

• Sign up to serve at one of the home building projects or at the ReStore that helps financially support the work that Habit does around Richmond.



Hope Tree

What They Do:

Through God's love, Hope Tree works to foster hope by empowering families, youth, and adults to lead fulfilling lives. They do this in two main ways:

(1) Working with Developmental Disabilities Ministry (DDM): Creating an environment in which adults with intellectual disabilities can experience the most complete life possible.

(2) Children & Youth Ministries: HopeTree serves children through residential and treatment foster care placements, clinical services, and through HopeTree Academy.

How To Get Involved:

 HopeTree Family Services Programs and Departments have a need for volunteers throughout the year and for various tasks. Volunteers may come on a regular basis to provide activities to our youth or adults in care or to provide lawn care/landscaping around our homes and office buildings. Volunteer activities that have taken place have included horseback riding lessons, exercise classes, photography, pottery, assisting our residents prepare for participation in Special Olympics, landscaping, and painting to name a few.



Fresh Start

What They Do:

A Fresh Start For Single Mothers And Their Children Community Outreach Mission Project is a unique faith based nondenominational 20 week program designed to provide an environment of positive support for single mothers and their children in which they will find encouragement, education, spiritual enrichment, growth, hope for daily living and the future. There is no charge to our families for the program.

How To Get Involved:

 Dinners For Meetings; Donate cookies, candy, juice boxes, supplies for meals, gift cards, food items; Small



home repairs and yard work for our moms, Sponsor: Storage Space, Sessions, Families in crisis, Pizza for kids, families for Christmas, Volunteer for childcare, as a teen mentor, early set up for meetings, clean up for meetings.



Caritas

What They Do:

CARITAS serves as the first line of community support for anyone in need of emergency shelter. Through their four programs (Shelter, Furniture Bank, Works, and The Healing Place), CARITAS provides support, training and material assistance to break the cycle of homelessness and restore stable productive lives.

How To Get Involved:

• Cleaning/organizing on-site, Personal Shopper, Tutoring and preparing individuals for employment.

Boaz & Ruth

What They Do:

Boaz & Ruth is an organization works to empower the physically blighted commercial corridor of Highland Park by restoring buildings, operating social enterprises and providing jobs. Rebuilding lives of men and women needing a second chance through relationships and training. Connecting Highland Park neighbors and our program participants to the wider Richmond community through shared experiences that bridge racial, economic and geographic barriers.

How To Get Involved:

 Coach a participant, Provide dinner for a class, Grant writing, Newsletter, Gardening, Painting facilities, Donate gently used clothing and household goods, or Volunteer at Harvest Thrift and Sunny Days.



Saints Prison Ministry



What They Do:

Traveling Softball Team to play with inmates to invest, encourage, love, and challenge. The Virginia Saints are a group of dedicated men who spend several weekends in the spring and summer traveling to area prisons to engage and invest in lives of inmates through the game of softball. However, they share more than the love of sport; they share the Gospel and personal testimonies with the men, wrapping up the day by giving inmates a chance to respond to Christ in faith.

How To Get Involved:

- Athletics: Use your softball talents for the Lord. We are always looking for new missionary athletes to join our teams.
- Side Line Disciples: Connect and minister to the inmates that are not on the field. The sideline action allows us to reach many more men for Christ.

Comfort Cases

What They Do:

Comfort Cases is an organization that is committed to engaging communities and educating the public about the issues facing youth in foster care.

Often times, children who enter the foster care system are given a trash bag to carry their belongings in. These children have been neglected and often feel like they don't matter. Many do not own a toothbrush or have a pair of pajamas.

A "Comfort Case" gives a child entering foster care a sense of dignity and hope. Each is packed with a cozy new pair of pajamas, a stuffed animal to hug, a toothbrush, soap, and other personal care items.

How To Get Involved:

 Make a difference in the life of a child in foster care, from making a monetary contribution, to organizing a Donation Drive, shopping our Amazon Wish List, or volunteering at our national center, there are many ways for you to make a difference.



Worthdays

What They Do:

Worthdays is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization whose mission is to mobilize our community to ensure that those impacted by the foster care system know that they are important, worthy and celebrated. Through the excitement of celebrating, we are engaging our community in a way that raises awareness and increases positive outcomes for our local foster care system. Through partnerships with local Departments of Social Services we are able to meet some of the very basic needs of kids in our foster care system while also using every opportunity possible to send the message that 'you are so worth it.

How To Get Involved:

Northside Outreach Center (NOC)

What They Do:

NOC is a non-denominational Christian-based 501(c)3, working to bring positive and lasting change to Highland Park. Since 2004, the NOC has been working to revitalize this area in the Northside of Richmond, VA with a desire to help it transform spiritually, relationally, and economically. They work to accomplish this mission through dynamic partnerships that provide tutoring, mentoring, intentional discipleship and community outreach programs which meet the holistic needs of those we serve.

How To Get Involved:

• Become a mentor; volunteer with the after school programming, Community Store, or at the Community Food Pantry; drop off large paper bags (with handles) which they use to distribute items from the food pantry.
